
# T-shirts from the Okinawan Festivals







# Okinawan Kenjinkai Worldwide

When Okinawans immigrated to foreign countries, they set up homelandoriented clubs to assist in their adjustment to their new lands. These clubs used the names of the native localities in Okinawa from where the immigrants came and served as the basic units of the Okinawan community. The clubs facilitated mutual aid and enabled fellowship among families who felt a bond of common origin.

As the number of clubs grew, associations of clubs, or kenjinkai, formed to encourage unity among Okinawans in their new countries. On an international level, the associations served as liaisons to Okinawa and provided a voice for Okinawans on issues important to them. Adjacent are the Okinawa kenjinkai around the world:

The Rinken Band, known worldwide as one of the top contemporary bands from Japan, has made a strong impact on the Japan music scene. Their unique sound blends traditional Okinawan tunes with an accent of American rock.

Formed in 1977 by Rinken Teruya, the Rinken Band has produced 20 albums and has performed in the United States, England, France, China, India, Phillipines, South Africa, Kenya, Madagascar, Peru, Columbia, Brazil, Bolivia, as well as in Japan and Hawaii. The band has also produced sound tracks and theme songs for various national TV programs.

Born in Okinawa City in 1949, Rinken is the band's leader, composer and producer. Important influences in Rinken's career include Rinsuke Teruya, his father a well known musician, and his grandfather, who performed classical Okinawan music. During his childhood years, Rinken listened to different music styles from all over the world in his father's record store. In 1967 he moved to Tokyo and made a career as a band musician. After many years in Tokyo he came back to Okinawa to create his original musical style based on the music of his island home.

#### Tomoko Uehara, Vocal, Taiko, Sanba, Sanshin

Tomoko's singing career started at age six, as a member of a family band. She joined the Rinken Band in 1988, influencing the band's performances with her powerful, beautiful voice and her cheerful stage presence. Tomoko creates all of the band's colorful stage costumes.

# Eisa Festival

Eisa is a traditional performing art found only in Okinawa. Performed during the summer months, is one of the observances to honor the ancestors. Young men and women dance and beat small drums (paranku), mid-sized drums (shime taiko), and large drums (o taiko). They are accompanied by tunes played on the sanshin (Okinawan shamisen).
